## *Statutory Declarations Act*

*Note 1* A person who intentionally makes a false statement in a statutory declaration is guilty of an offence, the punishment for which may include imprisonment under the Criminal Code.

**A statutory declaration under the *Statutory Declarations Act* may be made before any of the following –**

(1) a person who is currently licensed or registered under a law to practise in one of the following occupations:

Chiropractor	Dentist	Legal practitioner
Medical practitioner	Nurse	Optometrist
Patent attorney	Pharmacist	Physiotherapist
Psychologist	Trade marks attorney	Veterinary surgeon

(2) a person who is enrolled on the roll of the Supreme Court or the High Court as a legal practitioner (however described); or

(3) a person who is in the following list:

Agent of the Postal Corporation who is in charge of an office supplying postal services to the public

Consular Officer or Diplomatic Officer (within the meaning of the *Consular Fees Act 1955*)

Bailliff

Bank officer with 5 or more continuous years of service

Building society officer with 5 or more years of continuous service

Chief executive officer of a court

Clerk of a court

Commissioner for Affidavits

Commissioner for Declarations

Credit union officer with 5 or more years of continuous service

Employee of the Trade Commission who is:

(a) authorised under paragraph 3 (d) of the *Consular Fees Act 1955*; and

(b) exercising his or her function in that place

Fellow of the National Tax Accountants' Association

Finance company officer with 5 or more years of continuous service

Holder of a statutory office not specified in another item in this list

Judge of a court

Justice of the Peace

Magistrate

Marriage celebrant

Master of a court

Member of Chartered Secretaries

Member of Engineers, other than at the grade of student

Member of the Association of Taxation and Management Accountants

Member of the Defence Force who is:

(a) an officer; or

(b) a non-commissioned officer with 5 or more years of continuous service; or

(c) a warrant officer within the meaning of that Act

Member of the Institute of Chartered Accountants, the Society of Certified Practising Accountants or the National Institute of Accountants

Member of:

(a) the Parliament of a State; or

(b) a Territory legislature; or

(c) a local government authority of a State or Territory

Minister of religion registered under Subdivision A of Division 1 of Part IV of the *Marriage Act 1961*

Notary public

Permanent employee of the Postal Corporation with 5 or more years of continuous service who is employed in an office supplying postal services to the public

Permanent employee of:

(a) a State or Territory or a State or Territory authority; or

(b) a local government authority;

with 5 or more years of continuous service who is not specified in another item in this list

Person before whom a statutory declaration may be made under the law of the State or Territory in which the declaration is made

Police officer

Registrar, or Deputy Registrar, of a court

Senior Executive Service employee of a State or Territory or a State or Territory authority

Sheriff

Sheriff's officer

Teacher employed on a full-time basis at a school or tertiary education institution
